Junior High Ladyhorns Are District Champs

The junior high Ladyhorns are the district champions in basketball.

To earn the title, they participated in the district tourney, from Feb. 13-15 in Whiteface.

The Ladyhorns defeated the host team 33-9. Lilly Ramirez had 20 points; Candyce Neudorf, 10; Eden Trevizo, 2; and Natalie Gonzales, 1.

To clinch the title, the Ladyhorns defeated Lazbuddie 28-22. Ramirez had 15 points; Jazmine Carrasco, 8; Trevizo, 3; and Neudorf, 2.

Gerber, Hukill Win In Hart Primary Election

In the Castro County Judge's race in the Republican primary, incumbent Carroll Gerber won countywide and also in Hart, garnering 45 votes to challenger Gary Grand's 11. There were no candidates for the judgeship in the Democratic primary.

In the 242nd district court's race, the seat now occupied by retiring Ed Self, Gregg Hukill defeated fellow attorney Chris Brown. Hukill won in Castro and Hale Counties, and Brown narrowly won in Swisher County. In Hart, Hukill won 32-16. There were no Democratic candidates.

In Hart, Democrats David Alameel and Keshia Rogers each

won five votes for U.S. Senator. Statewide, there will be a runoff between the two. On the GOP side, incumbent Senator John Cornyn easily won in Hart, Castro County and statewide.

Wendy Davis got 14 votes in Hart for the Democrats in the governor's race, and Reynaldo Madrigal got four. Davis easily won statewide and will face Gregg Abbott, who received 44 votes in Hart.

In the three-way race for Agriculture Commissioner for Democrats, in Hart, Jim Hogan got 10 votes, Kinky Friedman, 2; and Hugh Fitzsimmons III, 3. There will be a runoff statewide between

Hogan and Friedman. In the GOP race, there will be a runoff between Sid Miller and Tommy Merritt. In Hart, Miller got 15 votes, and top vote-getter was the first name on the ballot, J. Allen Carnes with 18.

For Commissioner of General Land Office, George P. Bush got 43 votes in Hart and won statewide. John Cook was the only Democrat running. The two will face off in the General Election.

In the State Senator, District 31, race on the GOP side, incumbent Kel Seliger won the primary; in Hart, he got 28 votes to Mike Canon's 21. Seliger is unopposed in the fall general

election.

In the Railroad Commissioner race, there will be a runoff in the Republican primary between Wayne Christian and Ryan Sitton. Sitton got 19 votes in Hart, and Christian, 16. The winner of this race will face Democratic nominee Steve Brown in November. In Hart, Brown got 11 votes and Dale Henry, five.

In the Attorney General's race for the GOP, Dan Branch got 20 votes in Hart and Barry Smitherman, 19. Ken Paxton garnered 14. Paxton and Branch will face other in the runoff election. The Democrat the winner

will face in November is Sam Houston, who ran unopposed.

In the GOP Lieutenant Governor's race, David Dewhurst got 22 votes and Todd Staples, 19. Dan Patrick got eight votes. Dewhurst and Patrick will be in the runoff election. The winner will face Leticia Van de Putte, who ran unopposed.

In Hart, Randy Neugebauer got 44 votes; Donald May, 8; and Chris Winn, one, in the 19th district GOP race for representative. Neugebauer will face Neal Marchbanks of Lubbock, who ran unopposed as a Democrat.
