## Rosas Addresses Violations On Water Report

Adrian Rosas, City of Hart Public Utility Superintendent, told The Pulse on Wednesday

### Transfer Station Remains Closed

The Transfer Station for the City of Hart (on Avenue A) remains closed. Perhaps it will reopen next week.

At the City Council meeting on July 14, the station was discussed. Someone unloaded cotton burrs at the station, and it became full with the burrs and other items. The City chose to close it until it's cleaned.

Mayor Stanley Dyer asked Public Utility Supt. Adrian Rosas if he has any solutions. He said to "maybe charge a dumping fee."

Johnny Martinez, who lives across the street from the Station works on average, seven hours a week, and is paid \$10 an hour. He is to monitor comings-and-goings at the station. He is at the station from 4-6 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays and 9-12 noon on Saturdays. The station is otherwise to be closed.

Martinez is to direct the dumping, and is to sort the materials dumped, such as removing metal from wood piles.

Materials prohibited from being dumped at the Station are concrete, rubber tires, vehicle batteries, oil, household trash, and tree trunks over 12 inches in diameter. Household trash includes food, paper, cardboard, plastic bags, clothes, etc.

Also, grass clippings may be put in the City dumpsters if bagged. Grass clippings are not to be taken to the Station. And, there should be no dumping of items outside of the Station.

Material dumped is to be sorted prior to dumping: metal, branches, wood, plastic, etc.

It was noted that persons brought items to the Station faster than they could be removed.

The Council took no action on charging a fee.

that the violations reported by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality were due in part when a former Supt. left and a new one came on board (before Rosas took over). And, he said, former City Secretary Sue Hawkins helped monitor

the reporting.

*The Pulse* did not contact TCEQ as to whether they ask for reports they have not received.
