Board Realigns

After Erasmo Mata was sworn in to the Hart ISD Board of Trustees at the May 15 meeting, officers were elected.

Elodia Rodriguez is the new president on a 3-2 vote, replacing Angelica Ramirez. Ramirez is now the vice-president and Steven Reyna is the secretary.

Former HISD Supt. David Rivera had an attorney meet with the Board when he was superintendent, and it was explained that the president should have at least two years of experience. *The Pulse* reporter, Neoma Williams, spoke of this at the meeting, but Rodriguez told her that Interim Supt. Les Miller said that this is not required. Rodriguez is completing her first term.

Supt. Ken Rosser will be the athletic trainer for the school. His pay for this is a \$600 fee for continuing education.

Rosser told *The Pulse* that to contract with Lubbock Sports Medicine, the cost would be \$350 per game. The Board opted to use Rosser instead.
