Straley Tells Board 'Middle School Students Are Not Driven'

In explaining the STAAR scores to the school board at the July 15 meeting, Hart ISD Curricula Director Robin Straley said that the elementary scores have vastly improved. She said with the promotion of sixth-graders to middle school (these students have struggled for years with the state accountability tests), that she is expecting great strides from the elementary this coming school year. She attributes this to great teachers, but told the Board that it's a challenge to keep the students' passing the tests because of the turnover in teachers and administrators, and especially the challenges that come with rookie teach-

She said that students, primarily in Grades 6-8 (this past school year), don't pose discipline problems, but are not driven. Some went to summer school for a self-paced improvement program, and some didn't even bother to finish their class work.

She said that parents were contacted, but no help was forthcoming. During the school year, she said that some of these students don't do their homrwork or attend tutorials.

She added that these middle school students have struggled in elementary and, it seems, will struggle in secondary.

My father used to tell me it's so much easier to spend money than to make it.




