HISD STAAR Results (cont'd from Page 1)

Algebra I, Biology and U.S. History.

There are four standards required to have been met, with target scores in parentheses: Student Achievement, 59 (58); Student Progress, 32 (16); Closing Performance Gaps, 29 (28); and Postsecondary Readiness, 67 (57). These are the results district wide.

Elementary met standards on Student Achievement, 55 (55) and Closing Performance Gaps, 29 (28). It did not meet standards on Student Progress, 31 (33) and Postsecondary Readiness, 11 (12).

Secondary met standards on Student Achievement, 61 (55) and Postsecondary Readiness, 67 (57). Student progress isn't applicable and Closing Performance Gaps results were 28, and target score is 31.

Neither campus earned distinctions, which are awarded to campuses based on achievement in several performance indicators relative to a group of 40 campuses of similar type, size and student demographics.

The elementary campus did not meet standards in 2013, but the secondary did. Straley said that the elementary has a plan in place for improvements. The secondary will be developing a plan for improvement.

The Pulse asked Straley if the social studies scores in high school were adversely affected

because a teacher, no longer with Hart ISD, had given answers to some students during the testing phase this past spring. She said she had no definite answers to that, but she didn't think it would have made any difference.

Ramona Neudorf told *The Pulse* that those students who had been given answers did not have their tests scored.

Regarding how to improve test scores, Ken Rosser, superintendent, said that there will be three-week assessments, with teachers' tracking their students. From the assessment data, "We will know who is struggling," he said.

Music Instruction Returns To Hart Elementary

In other business, Rosser told the Board that music will be introduced to the elementary this school year. Juanetta Bocko will be the music teacher, and will continue her art instruction on the secondary level.

Rosser said that Rob O'Connor, science teacher, is a finalist for the Region 16 Teacher of the Year award.

Also announced at the meeting is the addition of Algebra I Pre-Advanced Placement classes for incoming freshmen. Next year, Biology will be added.
