Josh and Jessie Faucett and four-year old daughter, Hailly, moved to Hart in June. Josh is the new pastor for First Baptist Church.

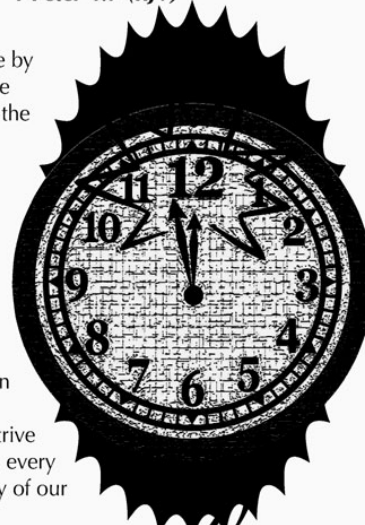
