Homecoming Culminates Tonight At Halftime

Game Starts At 8:30 Tonight

Homecoming 2014 for Hart ISD culminates today when the homecoming queen is crowned at halftime of the football game.

The game won't start until 8:30 p.m., Coach Adam Zepeda says, because there are too few officials who could be available at 7:30.

The Longhorns take on the Lazbuddie Longhorns, coached by former Hart head football coach Kevin Roberts. His son, Reagan, a former Hart Longhorn, will be playing for Lazbuddie.

The season started out great after the Longhorns travelled to Kress and soundly beat the Kangaroos 57-28. Jose Luna, who had to sit out his freshman season because of medical reasons, had a stellar performance in the Kress game with six touchdowns and 281 rushing yards.

A steady downpour of rain fell on the Friday night lights at Hart, but didn't stop the Longhorns until an injury to Luna changed things. At the half, Hart was up 18-0 against Lubbock's Kingdom Prep.

"We came out of the gates at halftime," said Zepeda. But, Abram Carlos tried to throw to Luna and it was intercepted by Kingdom Prep who made a touchdown.

In the fourth quarter with 2:35 left, Kingdom Prep made another touchdown, and the Longhorns hadn't scored again.

Hart didn't convert on extra points during the game. Zepeda said that the 'Horns relied too much on Adolfo Avila who made a name for himself last season with his extra points. Avila graduated in May.

In the fourth, Kingdom Prep scored again and made an extra point, winning the game 19-18.

Luna went down in the third quarter, and is likely out for the year with an anterior cruciate ligament injury to a knee.

The Longhorns were without Raul Gonzales, who injured an elbow in the Kress game. He has had surgery and Zepeda said his situation is "wait and see."

Justin Garcia, senior, reinjured a bone bruise, but is expected to return for tonight's game.
