

Massachusetts Couple Moves To Hart

Merton and Donna Lee Knightly moved to Hart in January of this year to be near their son, Ken Milus, and his wife, Vickie, and family.

Merton was born in New Hampshire, and raised in Maine. He has two brothers living in Maine, one sister living in New Hampshire, and one sister living in Florida. During his four-year enlistment in the Air Force, Merton was a Turret Systems Mechanic on the B-52 aircraft, and was stationed in San Antonio, Denver, Shreveport, and then Wichita Falls. After his discharge from the Air Force, he returned to Texas to enroll at LeTourneau College (which later became LeTourneau University), to pursue a course in Linotype Technology. LeTourneau is a private, Christian, Interdenominational University, located in Longview, Texas. It is named for its founder, R.G. LeTourneau, a world-renowned inventor and manufacturer of large earth-moving equipment.

After Merton completed his two-year program at LeTourneau, he worked for 25 years as a Linotype Operator,

setting type on Law and Medical Journals for Heffernan Press, a book publisher in Worcester, Massachusetts. (The invention of the Linotype machine in 1885 revolutionized the printing in-

dustry, because type could now be set by machine much faster than by hand. Today, however, most type is now set digitally, by computer.) After Heffernan Press closed its business during the recession, Merton worked another 22 years doing building maintenance, retiring in January this year.

Donna Lee had called Leicester, Massachusetts, home for more than 30 years before moving to Hart. Leicester's name (pronounced LES-TER) is of English derivation, as are the names of many towns in the New England area. She says the town's population is just under 11,000, and the countryside is "just beautiful," especially with the trees, and the colorful foliage in the fall. After graduating from high school, she became a secretary for two separate companies in the area. She had also worked at a college, and was an Exercise Guide at a Curves for Women Exercise Center. She has two sisters and a brother

who live in the Leicester area, and another brother and his wife, who live in Arizona.

While living in Leicester, Donna Lee and Merton were members of an Independent Baptist Church, called Lifesource Church (previously named Temple Baptist Church before the name was changed). Merton had formerly been raised in the Advent Christian Church, in Auburn, Maine, while Donna Lee grew up in the

Lutheran Church, in Auburn, Massachusetts. Merton was an early member of Lifesource Church, having participated in the actual construction of the building in 1974. After Donna Lee's first husband died in an auto accident, she and her two sons, Ken (13) and Jay (11) began attending services at Lifesource Church, where she and Merton first met.
