The campus consists of Grades 6-12 and had 119 students at testing time. The percentage of economically disadvantaged students is 88.2; English Language Learners percent is 4.2.

Hart Elementary met standard on all four indexes. For Index 1, Hart had 66 (60); Index 2, 43 (30), Index 3, 33 (28); and Index 4, 17 (12). There were 127 students enrolled at testing time for Grades PK-5. The percent of economically disadvantaged is 92.9; English Language Learners, 8.7.
